In June, Dr. Laura Cantu, Assistant Professor of Education, traveled to Moultrie, GA with a few College of Education students in partnership with the Physical Therapy Department and the School of Psychology.



The Brenau University COE raised funds to participate in the Moultrie Farm Worker Family Health Program this summer. For two weeks, students and faculty from several universities set up temporary clinics at camps and schools in south Georgia. The College of Education students helped migrant farm workers and their children. They worked alongside psychology majors at the schools in the mornings and worked where needed to assist medical teams at night. # College of Education goes to Panama

In May, Dr. Kelley Brock-Simmons led a servicelearning project that included five Women's College student ambassadors: Keren Kapwadi, Sarah Nolan, Imani Tornes, and Annabeth Vandiver. They traveled to a small public school, Loma Bonita, in the Coclé Province of central Panama.



The students were also able to experience a boat tour that allowed them to discover the diverse ecosystem of Panama.



The goal of this study abroad trip was to introduce Brenau students to a new culture in an authentic and meaningful way. Brenau students demonstrated teaching methods while engaging students in Pre-K – 9<sup>th</sup> Grades in an age and developmentally appropriate instructional activities.



Brenau students gained knowledge and skills that expanded their multicultural and global understanding. The school was located in a remote part of the country, far away from any common amenities that we are accustomed to. The children were extremely appreciative and one little girl stated "I will never forget you" in Spanish. The most noteworthy take away from the trip were the new friendships that were formed. The College of Education is hopeful to repeat this type of study abroad experience for students.
